

We are deeply grateful for their selfless contributions, which reflect the spirit of service and unity that defines our parish family.






# Rest in Peace, Fr. Kevin Tuitu'u CP



We, the Passionist family, mourn the unexpected loss of Fr. Kevin. Our parish family was blessed to share many years with him as a young, newly ordained priest. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, may perpetual life shine upon him. We are grateful to Fr. Tom for assisting in writing the following tribute to Kevin.

On Friday, 4 th October, our much-loved brother, Kevin, surrounded by his family, we his Passionist brothers, and with his closest friends, gave himself finally and fully into the arms of his Crucified Lord. After a severe stroke a few days earlier, Kevin was taken to RPA's Intensive Care, where he gently passed away. However, in the few days prior to that, Kevin had felt signs of what was happening and was not just resigned but accepting of this final call from God. Kevin asked for the final sacraments from Fr Tiernan, with a deep faith that he was being held safe in God's arms. Kevin had answered the call of Christ many times in his life. Kevin became one with Christ in his Baptism. In his vows, he gave himself to Christ Crucified in our Passionist family.

At his ordination, Kevin said yes to being one with Christ the High Priest in his ministry as a priest himself. Now, he is one with the saints in glory. Kevin was born in 1954 in the Hunter Valley but grew up in Wollongong.



Immediately after his schooling, he joined our Congregation, doing his novitiate in Adelaide and taking his vows in 1975, and his theological studies in Melbourne. Studies and assessments did not come easily, and Kevin had 3 academically brilliant classmates alongside whom he felt inadequate. However, "as Dean of Studies at the time, I saw in Kevin a courage, consistency and hard, hard work that gave him a depth of understanding that left others well behind him.

Kevin was ordained in December 1980 and had a varied ministry. He worked in our Marrickville parish as a young priest and again over twenty years later. He also ministered in our Adelaide parish. He was Superior and Parish Priest of our Hobart Parish. Kevin was the Director of our Retreat House at the Monastery Adelaide. He was a much-loved chaplain at St Joseph's Marist College, Hunters Hill and equally loved at Christian Brothers High School Lewisham. He also served as the provincial secretary for several years until his health made it challenging. In all these ministries, Kevin's reverence and sincerity, his extraordinary care for the underdog and those doing it tough, and his equally extraordinary wit, humour and total unpredictability in homilies were loved, appreciated and remembered.

Kevin also spent a number of years in our Passionist Mission in Vanimo, recently visited by Pope Francis. He loved telling the story of a visit

he paid to a family in their house on stilts. Kevin walked in and, given bruises size, immediately fell through the floor. So he did the visit, standing on the ground with the rest of him above the floor. Kevin had the wonderful gift of never taking himself too seriously! Kevin was a hard worker, a wonderful brother in community and a loval friend especially to those left out or left behind. He had a wonderful wit, a wonderful, and sometimes dark sense of humour. He had no time for pretense or carry-on, and had a clinical insight and ability to name self serving and self indulgence. He was a joy to sit with at table listening to his asides. Kevin was a man of holiness and faith. His room is full of icons, votive lamps, books on spirituality, orthodox and Eastern devotion, and mysticism. There are shelves of his journals covering the over fifty years of his life with the congregation.

It was a hard-won and authentic holiness, as Kevin had many battles in his life, with health and other challenges. His holiness and care for others came from knowing suffering himself, constantly having to reclaim and reaffirm his faith when yet another setback would come. These last years Kevin's health and suffering have been so crippling. Kevin knew Christ Crucified intimately, which is why Kevin was ready last week when Christ came to take him by the hand and lead him home.



Kevin died on the feast of St Francis of Assisi. St Francis saw death as just a step through the doorway into glory. He called death 'Sister; it was like being taken by the hand and being led into the arms of God, with Mother Mary and all the saints, all the loved ones gone before us there at Heaven's door awaiting to welcome us. We all will miss Kevin dearly. May he rest in peace.

# Thought for the week

*In these times of division, violence, and conflicts,* the second reading for this week from Hebrews is very assuring and comforting very personally. It reminds us that Jesus' incarnation and suffering are not just monumental cosmic events but deeply

personal acts of love that make us members of His family. When Jesus became human, He didn't come as a distant deity but as one of us, fully embracing the human experience. The incarnation shows God's desire for closeness with us—not just collectively, but individually. In becoming flesh, Jesus sanctified every part of human life, demonstrating that God is near to us even in the most ordinary moments.

Jesus' suffering was also personal. While His death on the cross was for all of humanity, it was also for each of us individually. In His agony in Gethsemane and on the cross, Jesus thought of each of us, bearing our specific sins and struggles. His suffering was not just a distant, theological eventit was an intimate sacrifice, showing the depth of His love for you and me. Jesus didn't just endure pain for a general cause but for the sake of every single person He loves.

Hebrews 2:11 tells us that Jesus is not ashamed to call us His brothers and sisters. Through His incarnation and suffering, He has invited us into God's family. This familial bond transforms how we live and relate to Him. We are not just followers; we are His siblings, loved deeply and personally. The cross is not only a symbol of universal redemption but also a personal declaration of God's intimate love for each one of us, calling us into a closer relationship with Him as part of His family.
