Thought for the Week

We are all aware of Pope Francis's Latest Encyclical letter, "Dilexit Nos" **He Loved us**. Reflecting on "Dilexit Nos," I'm reminded of the vastness of God's love—a love that knows no bounds and gives without expecting in return. This love is not abstract or distant; it's real, personal, and touches the depths of our everyday lives. Jesus's life, His willingness to share in our humanity and sacrifice Himself, was the ultimate expression of this love, one that says, "You are valued, you are cherished, you are beloved."

In my life, there are moments when I feel that love so clearly, like when someone offers a kind word just when I need it, or when I find the courage to help someone else, even in small ways. Each time I give of myself or reach out in kindness, I sense that I am participating in this divine love, reflecting just a bit of the love that has been given to me. It's not always easy; sometimes, I feel too tired, too busy, or even too hurt to love freely. But remembering "Dilexit Nos" calls me to try again, to love as He loves, despite my own limitations.

God's love encourages me to see others through that same lens of compassion and grace. It urges me to be patient, to forgive, to put others first, and to care for those around me. Even the smallest acts - a smile, a listening ear, a gentle word - become sacred and meaningful. In these moments, I realise I'm not only giving love but also experiencing God's love in return. His love transforms me, making me want to live in a way that brings hope, peace, and kindness to a world in need.

As I move forward, I'm inspired by this powerful truth: that God loved me first, wholly and completely, and that this love is both my foundation and my calling. May each day be an opportunity to live out "Dilexit Nos" in my actions, knowing that in loving others, I am most deeply loved myself.
