## **Lest we Forget**

This week, Australians and New Zealanders ANZAC DAY commemorated across the world in somber remembrance and Lest we forget pride for the fallen in the epoch-changing wars of the last century and other conflicts. The event was marked with traditional abiding dawn services, marches, speeches, music, wreaths, etc., honouring ultimate sacrifice. Fr Tom wrote a reflection for our Passionists website (passionists.com), which I like to share with you. "Anzac Day - mass and memories in the morning, two-up and footy in the afternoon. Tears and laughter. Perhaps a quintessentially Australian approach to grief, loss, gratitude and admiration - staying with the memories can be just too hard. Laughter without the memories, too shallow! Many of us whose grandfathers, fathers and uncles fought in World War 2 are familiar with the silence of so many of them ever to talk about their experiences. Many of us lived with the post-traumatic reality that the husbands and fathers who went to war were not the same men who returned. Our freedoms with their possibilities were won for us at such huge human cost. So often, we have seen the epitaph on memorials and in museums "Never Again". Never again we hoped. Never again we swore. Never again, we prayed, and pray, on days such as this. And yet.....!"

Years have passed, and we honour each year our brave women and men without fail as they deserve, but the freedom and peace they fought for seem to be a dream. Perhaps all our issues come from forgetting to remember, from neglecting to pause to ponder the essential. We can best honour the fallen who gave all, for us to stay free if we remain alert. To understand our past and learn the lessons from what has been. To carry the torch and teach those yet to be born what freedom means. The flame will be yours to keep, to pass to those who will know what to do. Go now; live a life to make past and future generations proud of you. Lest we forget.

### **Feast of Peter Chanel**

We join our Tongan community in celebrating St. Peter Chanel (1803-1841) was a missionary priest of the Society of Mary and a martyr who was sent to bring the Catholic faith to the Pacific Island Futuna, northwest of Australia between Fiji and Samoa. Peter was born in France. He worked as a shepherd boy and entered the minor seminary in 1819. He was ordained a priest in 1827 and was the first missionary to arrive on the small island kingdom of Futuna in 1837. He earned the title "the man with the kind heart" for the outstanding generosity with which he served the people. Peter was clubbed to death by the king's men. He was canonised in 1854.

## San Lupo Picollo

The members of San Lupo organisation will join the 10.30 am Mass this Sunday to celebrate San Lupo. You may have noticed a Shrine with marble to the Maria Goretti altar is dedicated to San Lupo. San Lupo was a French saint but lived in the Benevento Region of the Campagnia Province of Rome (outside Naples), the town is named after him. 
