People often share that Spring is their favourite season. They speak of it as a welcome reprieve from the dreary grey skies and the biting frost of winter. It is a time when the earth awakens, and tender green shoots push their way toward the sunshine. Others, however, find joy in the splendour of Autumn. They revel in the vibrancy of

changing colours and the soothing relief from summer's relentless heat. Both seasons, with their unique charms, offer a sense of renewal and beauty.

But at the risk of sounding overly pious, if I had to choose, give me Advent! *There's something deeply meaningful about this sacred season of purple, of* preparation, of waiting, and of wanting. It's a time when hope and expectation take centre stage—a season not just of anticipation but of intentionality. The quiet beauty of Advent invites us to slow down and focus on what truly matters.

This resonates powerfully with the reflections found in Susan Rowland's book, Make Room for God: Clearing Out the Clutter. In her candid and thoughtprovoking writing, Rowland shares her journey of de-cluttering life, not just of things but of distractions, habits, and misplaced priorities. "I felt lost in a cultural wilderness," she writes, "in clutter, collecting, consuming... in working, worrying, and waiting for something better." Consumption, she *explains, had become a companion in her life—familiar, easy, but ultimately* shallow. Too often, she admits, she settled for these fleeting distractions instead of choosing intimacy with God. Her words are a striking reminder that when our hearts ache, we often reach for something to soothe the pain. The challenge is ensuring we reach for the right salve—the one that truly heals and nourishes us.

Advent, then, becomes a time to do just that: to separate the treasure from the trash, to sift through the noise of our lives and re-centre on what truly matters. *In this sacred waiting, we are reminded that Jesus is our Star—our ultimate* guide, the one who orients us when we feel lost. He is the one who clears the clutter of our hearts and minds, inviting us into a deeper, more authentic relationship with Him.

As I reflect on this, I can't help but feel that we are living in a time that calls

for prophets. No, we don't have the likes of Jeremiah, Ezekiel, or Micah walking among us, but I find myself deeply grateful for the modernday voices of truth and love. Leaders like Pope Francis, alongside countless women and men across the globe, speak courageously, calling us to justice, compassion, and transformation. These voices

remind us that Advent is not just a passive waiting but an active conversion—a call to turn our hearts and lives toward God.

What a privilege it is to live in such a time! Yes, the challenges are great, but so too are the opportunities to grow, to serve, and to love. Advent invites us into this holy work, encouraging us to let go of what is shallow and to embrace what is lasting. It is a season of hope, of gratitude, and of transformation. And in that, we are blessed beyond measure.
