Dear sisters, brothers, and friends in the parish family,

Its already the 4th week in Lent, as each week passes, we are deeply aware of the enormous sufferings in/of the world. When all of us look out at a landscape of considerable wreckage and ruin, the immeasurable human suffering in all forms and the long-term effects yet to be seen, we may feel quite helpless and powerless. We may feel hemmed in, locked down not only in our physical lives (hard enough) but in our interior lives and essential human freedom of action and being. Even when those disintegrative forces become extreme and our suffering may seem overwhelming, however, a singularly important spiritual journey always remains open for us. We are not powerless in the face of all that suffering and evil. We have the power of prayer, and we have the power of love. The power of prayer and love is the very power of Jesus Christ, and that is the full power and might of God Almighty in this world.

While we may have begun Lent with many commitments, such as giving up a favorite food or doing an extra good deed, get in better physical shape, dedicate more time to spiritual reading or other holy exercises. One thing you can be certain that the deepest desire of our Lord for you this Lent is that you pray. It can help us answer the insistent spiritual urgings of the human heart, longings that can only be authentically fulfilled by God's loving presence.

In the beginning of the year, Pope Francis proclaimed a Year of Prayer starting on Jan. 21 and in one of his Angelus address said that it will be "a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in one's personal life, in the life of the Church, and in the world." "Prayer cannot be captured in a preestablished pattern because it is a manifestation of the believer's personal relationship with God himself within that intimate and exclusive relationship that distinguishes our faith," he said. The Year of Prayer, then, can help believers strengthen their relationship with God,

"offering moments of genuine spiritual rest," he said, likening it to "an oasis sheltered from daily stress where prayer becomes nourishment for the Christian life of faith, hope and charity."

Pope requests as he said "I ask you to intensify your prayer to prepare us to live this event of grace well and to experience the power of God's hope. That is why today we begin a Year of

Prayer." "Bringing God's salvation to everyone was for Jesus the greatest joy, his mission, the meaning of his existence ... And in every word and deed with which we join with him in the beautiful adventure of giving love, light, and joy multiply not only around us but also within us,".

The Funder of the Passionists St. Paul of the Cross, as a man of great prayer, inculcated its importance most forcefully by word and example. He wished his followers to pray without ceasing and desired our communities to become real schools of prayer, leading to a deep experience of God (Passionist Rule and Constitutions, #37.)

At the heart of our prayer is the Crucified Christ. Prayerful contemplation on Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection enables us to bring the fruit of that contemplation to those who are Christ Crucified in today's world by standing in solidarity with those who suffer.

As we journey the holy season of Lent, reflect upon your practice of prayer, you make a commitment to discover more. There is no limit and no end to the depth to which God wants to draw you through prayer. True prayer is never boring. When you discover true prayer, you discover the infinite mystery of God, and your hearts deepest yearning.
