Dear sisters, brothers and friends in the Parish Family,

Summer holidays continue for some, back to work for many. Our Parish Office opened this week, and the regular routines are getting back underway.

The Christmas decorations have come down; the Christmas cribs will be dismantled this coming week. The Church begins what we call 'Ordinary Time', and it seems Christmas is over for another year.

But Christmas is never 'over'!!

Christ come to dwell among us, Jesus come to share our lives, to live in our hearts, to make all this world the 'tabernacle' of his presence. Emmanuel, God-with-us. No, Christmas is never over. And there is no such thing as 'Ordinary' time. The presence Jesus makes every moment of every day something extraordinary, pregnant with possibilities and potential.

We say of our Passionist saint, St Gabriel, who died still a student at age 24: "He did nothing extraordinary, but he did the ordinary things extraordinarily well! Sr Elenita is preparing the rosters and schedules for the Scripture on the Government schools, and the sacramental programs for 1st Communion, Reconciliation and Confirmation. Sr Rosana and the RCIA team are beginning shortly to continue preparing adults for baptism and confirmation. Jenny Solo is getting the Youth ministry underway.

Work has begun on modernising and refurbishing the facilities of Shrubland Hall. This has happened through the generosity of the many who attended our fundraising functions, and the generosity of our parishioners, We are in the process of replacing the ageing kitchen and catering facilities of the hall.



Work continues getting Council approval for the removal of the dead palm trees beside the Church. We also hope soon the Blue Cross will be shining fully again. So, lots of activities seemingly small and ordinary, but all of them helping to make our parish ready for another extraordinary year.

We have an urgent need to support the extended family of one our neighbours, an Australian citizen, who's family is in grave danger in one of the world's trouble spots.

This family of 19 have all been granted Australian visas and will, with your help, be leaving danger to join us here in the Newcastle region.

We are seeking to raise \$20,000 to cover the cost of transportation to and visas for a relatively safe neighbouring country, where the family will be able to access the Australian diplomatic mission for the region. Some of the funds raised will also be used to house and feed the family in the safe country, while documentation is complete and flights to Australia are arranged. We have not identified the countries involved to avoid exposing the family who are in hiding.
