During the course of the week, while we were asleep the people in North America, in certain parts of Mexico, the United States and Canada witnessed the total solar eclipse. The stunning images that were published gave us a glimpse of a magnificent, rare phenomenon that a few people got to experience: one of the great natural wonders. As the moon travelled in front of the sun, light began to do strange things. In the shadows of trees, one could see the shape of the moon dancing in the breeze. As the moon nears totality, one could see, with eye protection, the disk of the moon covering the sun. But the main event is totality. When the moon completely covered the sun, everything darkened, a coolness suddenly fell over everything, and when you looked up through your eclipse glasses, you saw the corona of the sun, the outermost crown of the suns atmosphere reaching out into space. The corona is usually hidden by the blinding brilliance of the suns light, but on this special day, one sees what is hidden.

Pseudo-Dionysius the Areopagite, a 5th or 6th -century theologian, opens his Mystical Theology with:

Trinity! Higher than any being,
any divinity, any goodness!

Guide of Christians in the wisdom of heaven!
Lead us up beyond unknowing and light,
up to the farthest, highest peak
of mystic scripture,
where the mysteries of God's Word
lie simple, absolute and unchangeable
in the brilliant darkness of a hidden silence.
Amid the deepest shadow
they pour overwhelming light
on what is most manifest.
Amid the wholly unsensed and unseen
they completely fill our sightless minds
with treasures beyond all beauty.



For Pseudo-Dionysius, God can be found in the spaces between, in the darkness, and in the silence. Like the total eclipse, the brilliance of God can be seen around the edges of the darkness and then only obliquely.

To see the full brilliance of God is overwhelming and blinding, but we can't help but find ways to look. When our eyes are trained to look for God in the darkness, the silence, the hidden places, we find God in those places, and often, the light around the edges is more dazzling than we can bear. As we journey through the Easter season, we are invited to find ways to look, to look into Christ the light.

Our children and teachers' staff at both our schools will get a much-deserved couple of weeks; break to rest, refresh and regroup for the next term.
