Dear sisters, brothers and friends in the Parish Family,

Papua New Guinea is close to Australia but a long way from Sydney. However our parish has always had close links with our Passionist communities and mission on Vanimo on the far northern coast -on the border of West Papua-Irian Jiya, and at St Jospeh's in Port Moresby, the largest parish in Papua New Guinea.

Frs John Curtis, Aidan Kay, Tim O'Toole, Fr Kevin Dance and myself have all been parish priest of St Joseph's. In our community here in St Brigid's, Br Jim Coucher, Br Martin Lusk, Br Damian Byrne, Fr Ron Davoren, Fr Kevin Tuitu'u, Fr Peter Gardiner have all loved and served the people in Vanimom over periods ranging from 45 years to 4 years. Others members of the parish in the past like our present Superior General and parishioners, Fr Joachim Rego, Fr Peter Gaughan, Fr Jacob, Fr Tony Simbel, Fr Joseph Liaia, Fr Paul Merceica and Br Jeff Daly have also worked there.

For many years, the 'candle money' each year was sent to support the students and priests - often amounting to \$20,000 annually.

This week, PNG has been in the news again, with the recent violence. But also with the Religious Profession of two of our young Passionist novices, Edward Linden and Christopher Kaire. In the full church of St Joseph's., despite the curfews, Our Provincial, Fr Denis, received the first vows of these two newest passionists for our Congregation.

They now proudly wear our Passionist Sign on their breast, and write CP (Congregation of the Passion)after their names.

We are blessed that these two men wish only to love Jesus Crucified, to serve and care for the poor, and live community life within our Passionist community.
